With the assistance of Mrs. Betty Delafosse in writing a grant proposal, Father James' vision became a reality February 2013 through funding of a \$10,000 grant from the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) to implement the "I AM" Program.

The "I AM" Program, works to provide children who are legally free for adoption.... with a forever family.

Please open your mind and heart to a child. Adoptive and foster parents are needed everyday; and we know that many of you want to help by answering the call.



#### I AM -

I AM stands for Increasing Adoptive Measures.

In the Book of Exodus, Moses asks God what should he say when the Israelites ask him who sent him. God's reply was, "This is what you should tell the Israelites, I AM sent me to you." We are trying to bring this program to the community at large because God has sent us. We want to help children who are available for adoption and those in foster care to find a home with a family wanting to share their love with a son or daughter.



### WHAT -

The Goals of the "I AM" Program are:

- To inform the church and local community about the need for adoptive and foster families, particularly for African-American children.
- To provide information about what is required to become a foster/adoptive parent, and identify families interested in becoming certified foster /adoptive parents.
- To provide information about children who are available for adoption; and create opportunities for potential adoptive families and children to meet.





# WHY-

The "I AM" Program is important because:

- Children in foster care have done nothing wrong.
  They have been removed from their homes, because they weren't safe there. Many of them are from our community, and they deserve a family that will love, nurture, and protect them.
- There are more than 4,038 children in foster care in Louisiana.
- $\bullet\,$  As of January 2014 there were more than 538 children in foster care in the Lafayette Region.
- 49% or 264 of these children are African-American.
- 167 of these children are from Lafayette Parish
